1. Continuation of Health Coverage (COBRA)

COBRA coverage affords workers and their families who lose their health benefits the right to choose to continue group health benefits provided by their group health plan at least 18 months in certain circumstances such as involuntary job loss. Since your employer is not required to pay a portion of your premium, you may pay the entire amount, but the cost is usually less than if you obtained coverage on your own
